



Welcome to the first edition of “The Pot of Gold”.

The center has been open for two years now and the trees branches reach to the edges of Lander. During this time many wonderful people have come to Lander from all over the world.

Our primary industry here in Lander is NOLS, the National Outdoor Leadership School, which trains people to survive in the wilderness. The Wind River Mountains are some of the toughest to survive in and thus the main headquarters of NOLS is here. At any given time we have people from all over the world training here.

I have lived in Lander for ten years and it is one of the most charming places I have lived anywhere in the country. It has about 7,500 people. The country is high mountain dessert. Our home “Rainbow’s End” is on an old ranch that was divided, about 8 years ago. We live at about 6,000 ft. and the foothills of the Wind River Mountains and Red Butte, a local land mark are the view from our front window.

We have a sister center, The Wellness Connection, that has opened in the last year. Lander is developing quite a community of alternative healers, with acupuncture, naturopathic, Native American healers from the Wind River Reservation (the largest reservation in the country) and new people are arriving here all of the time, called by spirit to come.

Local attractions include the Red Canyon Loop Drive through beautiful BLM land (Bureau of Land Management), Sinks Canyon and Shoshone National forest, the switchbacks which go into the mountains to Fry Reservoir, Fiddler Lake and Louis Lake. Camping and fishing are available almost everywhere. Everywhere the eye looks there is beauty.

Lander has pleasant winters. We do have snow, but it is light and fluffy, rather than wet and heavy. Average rainfall is 12 inches per year. Summers are hot and we can get temperatures into the 104-106 range, it only lasts a few weeks. Average mean temperature is about 40-50 degrees.

Thermopolis, Wyoming is only 70 miles away, a lovely drive through the Wind River Canyon. It has three bath houses holding hot pools of varying degrees, both indoor and out, water slides and saunas. Thermopolis offers a number of massage therapists, some who do Watsu, water massage.

We are three hours from Jackson Hole, Wyoming where skiing, hiking, back-packing and in the spring and summer tourist from all over the world flock to Yellowstone Park and the Grand Teton, home of the Royal Retreat of the Masters on the enteric level.

We have leaped into the age of technology over the last few months and we are learning as fast as we can. We appreciate your patience. We plan to have clips of the monthly channelings with St. Germain in the newsletter and we will be archiving the channelings for future downloading.

Full Moon
